Repairs to the mechanically stabilized earth (MSE retaining wall located on the south side of the I-55 EB ramp to Damen/Ashland Ave in the City of Chicago, Cook County. This work will include soil anchors, grouting of the voids, drainage system repairs, joint sealing, pavement patching as well as various striping and other work necessary to complete the repairs.

Describe the scope of the extension (supply, service, etc.). Show justification for extending the original emergency contract, and explain why the extension need cannot be met through a competitive process.

Current contract progress as well as coordination with the Bridge Office and Soil Nail Designer is causing a delay in how fast some of the work can be completed. Contractor has submitted a number of Requests for Information (RFI) in order to clarify the repairs needed as well as the method of repair - specifically dealing with Type I and Type II repair details based on existing field conditions; Soil Nail embedment dimensions, including issues with the maximum creep exceeding specifications, etc.). IDOT has needed time to analyze the requests and formulate responses to the contractor which has delayed the project.
